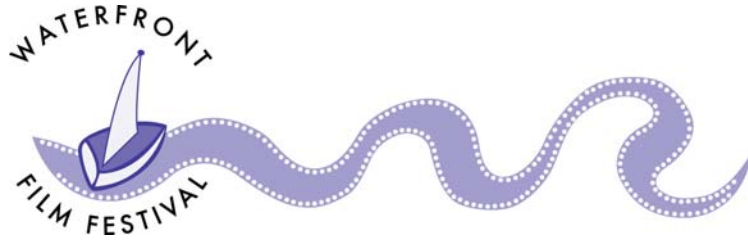

Waterfront Film Festival and SABA Hold Fundraiser in Saugatuck
Second Fundraiser Planned for Grand Rapids in March

Saugatuck, Michigan, November 7, 2007 – The Waterfront Film Festival and Saugatuck Area Business Association are sponsoring the popular mid-winter fundraiser, “Dinner and the Movies,” on Friday, Jan. 25.

Tickets for the event, which is open to the public, are \$65 per person. Fox 17 anchor Michele DeSelms will once again serve as MC for the event. Proceeds will benefit the 10th Annual Waterfront Film Festival, which will be held June 12-15 in Saugatuck.

“ ‘Dinner and the Movies’ is a unique mid-winter fundraiser that pairs good food and great short films to support the Waterfront Film Festival,” said Kori Eldean, co-founder of WFF. “In 2008, we will celebrate our 10th anniversary of bringing independent films and filmmakers to West Michigan.
